

ECONOMIC IMPACT

BioForward was proud to share the results of this year's "Wisconsin Biohealth: Industry Landscape and Economic Impact Report" which highlighted the statewide biohealth industry as a leading economic growth and innovation driver for Wisconsin.

According to the report, prepared by TEConomy Partners, LLC, Wisconsin's biohealth industry is outperforming most major state industries in terms of job growth and wages. Among the highlights within the third-party report are:



ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Total state economic impact contribution by the biohealth industry is \$28.8 billion in direct, indirect, and induced sources
- \$1 billion in state and local taxes



JOBS

- Wisconsin's biohealth research organizations, manufacturers, digital health, and distribution companies directly employ more than 46,000 individuals
- Have seen 8% job growth since 2015, outpacing the state's overall job growth of 3%
- This employment supports more than 72,000 additional jobs, leading to the full biohealth job impact reaching nearly 119,000 jobs throughout the state of Wisconsin



WAGES

 The high-quality jobs generated across the biohealth industry pay more than \$87,000 on average (79% above the overall industry average in Wisconsin)



FUNDING

- Wisconsin-based institutions and organizations received almost \$500 million in National Institutes of Health funding in 2019 (an increase of 22% since 2015)
- Venture capital and angel investments in Wisconsin's biohealth industries totaled \$517 million during the 2015-19 period
- Wisconsin biohealth companies received a combined 131 Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) awards totaling \$71 million between 2015-2019

"More than just mere numbers in a report, this insight highlights the state's vibrant and dynamic biohealth industry as a crucial impact to Wisconsin's economic growth," said BioForward Wisconsin CEO Lisa Johnson. "The billions in economic impact for our state combined with the thousands of high-paying jobs play a significant role in our state's economy.

As importantly, individuals and organizations in this industry are essential to the treatment of, and solution to, the COVID-19 pandemic."


