Our commitment to advocacy, collaboration, education, and networking continues to deliver exceptional value to our members. Additionally, I'm excited to share significant milestones achieved for both the state and the biohealth industry.

A major accomplishment was securing Wisconsin's designation as a Tech Hub by the Economic Development Administration (EDA). This recognition underscores Wisconsin's strengths in personalized medicine, biohealth technology, precision manufacturing, and automation—key drivers of statewide economic growth, global competitiveness, and national security.

Recent legislative support further demonstrates our state's dedication to fostering innovation. Wisconsin Act 96 allocates \$7.5 million in grant funding to drive statewide economic growth through Tech Hub Phase 2 initiatives. This support not only strengthens our application for EDA Phase 2 funding but also signals robust endorsement from the state for our biohealth leadership.

Awaiting the outcome of our Phase 2 application submitted in February, we anticipate monumental rewards. If successful, we stand to gain \$50 to \$75 million in federal funds, positioning Wisconsin at the forefront of global biohealth innovation.

Wisconsin's biohealth sector, a \$32 billion economic powerhouse, is crucial to our state's prosperity. With a growth rate of nearly 11% from 2018-2021 and a 2.5 jobs multiplier effect for every biohealth position, our impact is profound. Coupled with a robust manufacturing network experiencing 29% growth in biomanufacturing since 2018, Wisconsin is a national leader.

This success isn't just an opportunity; it's a strategic imperative for our future. It highlights Wisconsin's commitment to innovation, security, economic prosperity, and global competitiveness. As we look ahead, BioForward remains dedicated to accelerating momentum, uniting the industry, and driving progress for our members and the broader biohealth community.

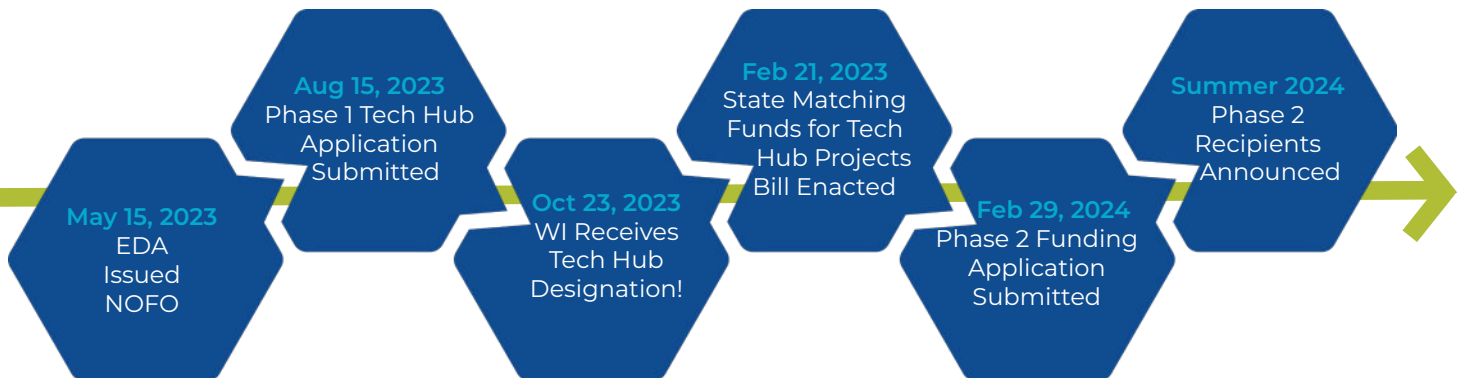

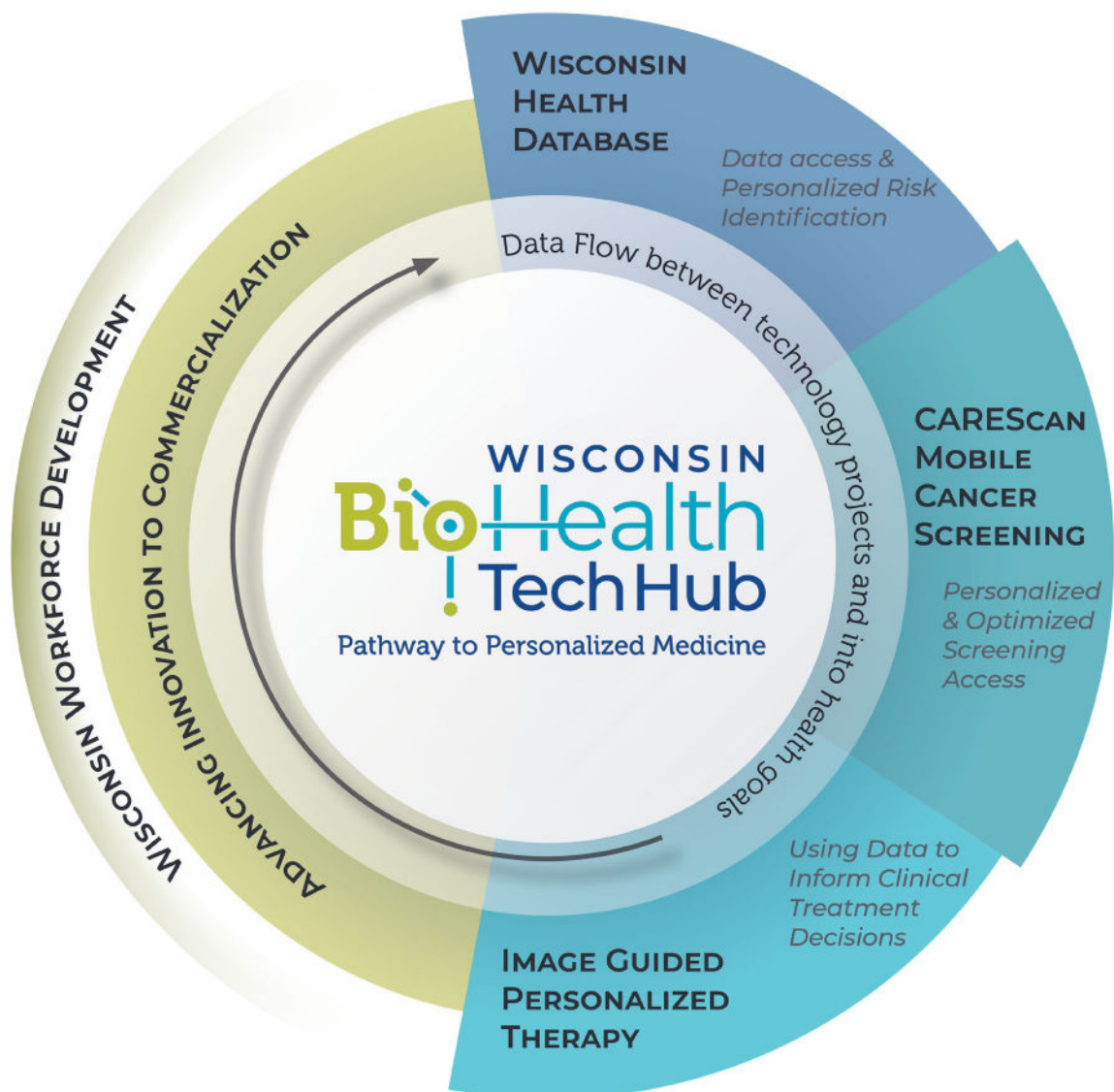

THE PROJECTS



Five interconnected projects, led by Wisconsin Biohealth Tech Hub Governance, will unite innovation, technology, and workforce development initiatives, building a world-class personalized medicine center.

1. Wisconsin Health Database- aims to establish a cyber-secure repository of health data from health partners across the state, reducing the cost and time required to bring new therapies to market. Led by UW-Madison.

2. CAREScan Mobile Cancer Screening- addresses health disparities by deploying mobile cancer screening fleets in underserved communities, collecting valuable biomarker data. Led by Medical College of Wisconsin.

3. Image-Guided Personalized Therapy- using data to support clinical treatment decisions, supporting the growth of theranostics and driving innovation in personalized medicine. Led by GE HealthCare.

4. Advancing Innovation to Commercialization- provides a critical support network for entrepreneurs, offering lab space, investment attraction, capital efficiency and derisking strategies, to move innovations commercialization. Led by BioForward.

5. Wisconsin Workforce Development- ensures a skilled workforce to sustain sector growth by creating inclusive talent pipelines aligned with employer demands. Led by Madison College and Milwaukee Area Technical College.

Date of enactment: February 21, 2024
Date of publication*: February 22, 2024

2023 WISCONSIN ACT 96

AN ACT to repeal 20.192 (1) (ar); and to create 20.192 (1) (ar) of the statutes; relating to: a technology and innovation hub grant to BioForward, Inc., and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert the following amounts for the purposes indicated:

SECTION 2. 20.192 (1) (ar) of the statutes is created to read:

20.192 (1) (ar) *Regional technology and innovation hub grant.* Biennially, the amounts in the schedule for the grant to BioForward, Inc., under 2023 Wisconsin Act ... (this act), section 4 (1).

SECTION 3. 20.192 (1) (ar) of the statutes, as created by 2023 Wisconsin Act ... (this act), is repealed.

SECTION 4. **Nonstatutory provisions.**

(1) **REGIONAL TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION HUB GRANT.**

(a) The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation shall provide sponsorship funding for purposes of this state's designation as a regional technology and innovation hub under 15 USC 3722a. The funding shall be in the form of a grant of \$7,500,000 awarded to BioForward, Inc., in its capacity as the lead consortium member

of the consortium formed for purposes of this state's federal designation as a regional technology and innovation hub. The grant awarded under this subsection is not subject to s. 238.03 (3) (a).

(b) To the extent consistent with the purposes of a federal grant awarded under 15 USC 3722a (f), BioForward, Inc., shall expend all grant moneys for the following projects:

1. The establishment in this state of a clinical workflow and supply chain support center for image-guided therapies and theranostics.
2. The construction of expanded shared lab space at Forward BIOLABS, Inc., the construction of new Forward BIOLABS, Inc., lab space, and the development of lab-related programming and support for the expansion of Forward BIOLABS, Inc.

* Section 991.11, WISCONSIN STATUTES: Effective date of acts. "Every act and every portion of an act enacted by the legislature over the governor's partial veto which does not expressly prescribe the time when it takes effect shall take effect on the day after its date of publication."



Wisconsin has the companies, talent and innovative thinkers required to continue advancing the development of personalized medicine. The grant funding for the Tech Hub Phase 2 initiatives from our state legislators underscores the importance of this moment and what it means for Wisconsin.



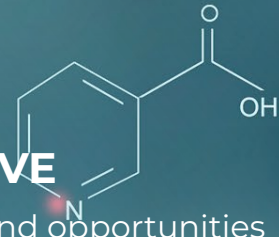

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES 2023-2024

Advancing Environmental Health and Safety (EHS)

The **BioForward EHS Working Group** was initiated by EHS leaders from Illumina and Promega in 2022-2023. Since then the group began bi-monthly Zoom discussions open to all members to collaborate, align, and improve EHS strategies and operations throughout our industry. The group has also partnered with external organizations to attend regional networking events.

Diversifying the Supply Chain

Increase Student Engagement

Acknowledging the significance of nurturing our state's young scientists, we initiated the **Annual Biohealth Communications Competition** in 2021. Initially targeting graduate students and fellows, it aimed to enhance their communication and presentation skills. In 2023, we expanded the competition to include undergraduates, greatly increasing the outreach (see pg 17).

Reporting on Industry Progress

Every two years, BioForward partners with TEconomy to publish an economic impact study analyzing Wisconsin's biohealth ecosystem, providing crucial insights for talent acquisition, retention, investor education, and legislative advocacy. Work for the upcoming October 2024 report is already in progress including a new section on data relevant to the WI Biohealth Tech Hub.

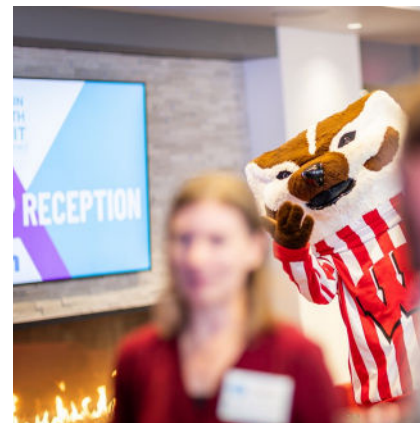
